### **MATERIAL LIST**

**HOOK:** Daiichi 1110 or TMC 101 size 14 for demonstration

**THREAD:** Roman Moser gsp power silk olive 10/0 or Danville 6/0 olive or Ultra 70 Denier Gray Brown

**TAIL: ##** MFC Micro Fibbets dun barred black or Natural grizzly hackle

**BODY:** Superfine Dubbing, Brown and Olive Brown

**WING: ##** Hareline Sparkle Emerger Gray

**HACKLE: ##** Olive Grizzly size 12 ( one size larger that the hook)

**NOTES:** This is a single wing profile, mayfly, cripple. This fly is featured in Kelly Gallup's book *Cripples & Spinners*, and is characterized as being his single most important contribution to our practice. While tying the fly, we will be focusing on dubbing, palmering hackle, creating a thread trap for the wing and creating an arc in the hook to represent the arc of the insect caught in the surface film.
