Maurice Richard Hatch was born in Marin County, CA and moved to Sacramento with his family when he was 4 years old. As the third child of four, he was always interested in animals of all kinds. His first love was birds, and then reptiles, before finally focusing on fish at the age of 15. He was fortunate enough to have a grandfather that had a private bass pond in the foothills of Northern

California. He was influenced by his grandfather and uncles who were avid fishermen of bass and trout. As a senior in high school, he was introduced to fly fishing by some close friends. After that, he was hooked and decided to forget conventional fishing and only pursue fish on the fly. He also had careers as a ski instructor/coach and restaurant manager as well as racing road bikes before focusing his full-time attention on guiding. Maury has been fly fishing the western United States and Mexico for 35+ years.

After honing his skills with trout, he hooked his first Striped Bass in 1995, and has been chasing, catching, and releasing stripers ever since. As a Captain, he guides both out of the San Joaquin Delta in a center console bay boat in the fall and spring, and then on a jet sled on the Feather and the American Rivers in the summer for stripers, Small Mouth Bass and shad. All trips include top-of-the-line



equipment as well as custom-tied flies.



Maury is also an ambassador level, pro-staffer for the following products: Costa sunglasses, Simms clothing, Sage rods, RIO lines and Galvan reels. He is the Co-event Manager for the Costa Bass-N-Fly Tournament and annually hosts trips to Baja with Gary Bulla, Tarpon Cay Lodge in the Yucatan and Christmas Island.

I have already received quite a few messages from our viewers that they enjoyed the program, and wish to see more. Their wish is my command.



SPFF'S FLY TYING CONTINUES IN THE AGE OF CORONAVIRUS

March 11, 2020 ~ The Beginning Fly Tying graduates received their diplomas.

Typically, our graduates would join our regular Wednesday night fly tying sessions to learn additional tying techniques and create more complex flies.

March 20, 2020 ~ Gov. Gavin Newsom ordered all Californians to shelter-in-place.

Now, with the shelter-in-place order, in-person fly tying was out of the question. I was concerned that without having a continuing instruction experience our graduates would soon lose interest in fly tying. So, what to do?

April 16, 2020 ~ First attempt using Zoom

I contacted the grads & told them I'd try starting some tying sessions, teaching simple patterns using the limited materials they were issued in the class. Initially there were some major challenges with the camera, the lighting and the Zoom app. After few weeks of stumbling, everything began to fall into place.

The highlights.....

- The Camera & Lighting issues were resolved.
- The students and I got much better at using Zoom. (Thanks Cat White)
- Some PHW Vets and a few of the regular Wednesday night tiers got wind of what we were doing and joined the group.
- Cece Rubin notified all the SWC Clubs about our meetings, and Cat White put out the word on SPFF's Fly Tying Group Facebook page. Even more folks joined in.
- In May all participants began receiving a schedule of the flies we'd be tying and their material lists. This allowed everyone to choose which flies they wanted to tie, get their materials, and join in for tying on the appropriate dates.

So, what started as an experiment with a small group has now grown to 95 participants, with 20-30 usually attending our meetings. A few of our tiers are in the process of setting up cameras so they too can host meetings and teach some flies. This is wonderful news for me!

It appears that Zoom is how we'll continue to meet for the foreseeable future. Contact me at education2@spff.org if you'd like to join the group. We meet from 6:45 to about 9:00 every Wednesday.

Many thanks to all the participants & helpers. I long for the day we can get back to in-person Dinner & Fly Tying sessions.

CLEANING FLY LINES

Something I found that you might like. It's a fully desiccated cotton washcloth that is about the size of an Alka Seltzer tablet. Dunk it in water and it instantly becomes approximately 8x8-inches. I'm guessing these were invented for removing peanut butter and jelly from the faces of 3-year olds, but they are fantastic for cleaning lines.

Each "tablet" comes in a wrapper (think a Chinese fortune cookie). Add a spritz or two of 303 and you're in business for cleaning fly lines.

There are a bunch of different brands and quantities available from Amazon (of course!) Search under dry wipes, compressed towels, dry towels, etc. The brand I got is labeled KXCDTECH and comes in a container of 100.

They are also perfecto for use in gas station bathrooms, campsites, et cetera. Truly amazing!
