HOOK: #14-#16 TMC100 or similar std. dry fly hook

THREAD: Olive Veevus 12/0 or similar

SHUCK / UNDERWING: Amber or Yellow Z-Lon or Antron Yarn

BODY: Olive or Brown Olive Super Fine Dubbing

WING: Light Deer Hair (not bleached) (look for a hide that has thin individual hairs)

LEGS: (Optional) Micro or Mini Varigated Round Legs - your choice of material &.

The Butch Caddis was designed to fish in fast water where visibility is difficult, and also works great for imitating a fluttering adult. The reverse style wing ensures that it floats with the abdomen in the water; however, the wing sits high and is virtually impossible to sink.
