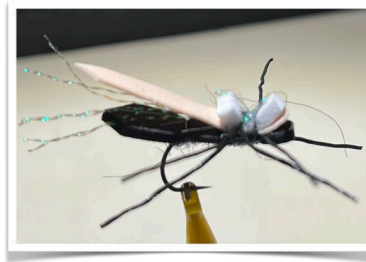

Notes: This is a variant of the Dornan Water Walker using thinner foam so it floats lower in the film. It has simpler rubber legs, 8 instead of 6 (Montana trout apparently can't count) and is slightly smaller. It is tied on #12 hook, while Dornan's may be larger. David Hoffberg and I caught a bunch of great fish with this fly in somewhat challenging conditions so we know it works. The picture is of a slightly chewed fly that caught a rainbow of about 19".

MATERIAL LIST

HOOK: ## TMC 206BL #12

THREAD: UNI 6/0 Black

OVERBODY: ## 1 mm black foam

FLASH: ## Krystal Flash, Smolt Blue (#20)

BODY: ## Peacock Ice Dubbing

LEGS: ## Black round rubber legs, small

WING: ## 0.5 mm Razor foam, tan or white (The Spot doesn't have tan). May color white with marker or leave alone.

INDICATOR: ## 2 mm foam - white for tan wing, orange for white
